



Communitas is currently seeking candidates for our scholarship to support the post-secondary education of students whose parents are or have previously been incarcerated.

Communitas is a Montreal based registered charity dedicated to supporting prisoners and ex-prisoners during their reintegration. We use the principles of Restorative Justice to build relationships that support (ex-)prisoners as they face the challenges of returning to community. Research has shown the negative effects of parental incarceration on a child's educational prospects,¹ and we hope that by facilitating access to education for the children of (ex-)prisoners the negative impact of crime and its consequences will be reduced.

Eligibility criteria: Canadian citizens or permanent residents pursuing post-secondary education in any field at a Canadian university or college who has or has had one or more of their parents incarcerated in a Canadian penitentiary.

Selection criteria: Candidates will be evaluated on (1) their academic record, (2) community contributions, and (3) the impact that receiving a scholarship would have on the candidate's education. We strongly encourage all eligible candidates to apply.

Value: The value of the scholarship for the 2019-2020 year will be \$1300 CAD.

Deadline to apply: Applications for the scholarship will be accepted until 23:59 Eastern Time on February 29, 2020.

What to include in your application: Interested and eligible students should send the following information to Communitas for consideration:

1. A cover letter introducing yourself and clearly explaining how you meet the eligibility and selection criteria
2. A current copy of your school transcript
3. A current proof of enrolment from your school
4. Contact information to allow the selection committee to follow up with you as needed
